

Interpreting Your MTLE Score Report

1 Subtest Status

If you received a scaled score at or above the "Minimum Passing Score," you will received a "Passed" status. If you receive a scaled score below the "Minimum Passing Score," you will receive a "Not passed" status. To pass the entire test, you must pass each subtest.

2 Your Subtest Score

The total subtest score is based on the number of raw score points earned on each section (multiple-choice section and constructed-response section); the proportion accounted for by each section, if applicable; and the scaling of that score. Raw scores are converted to a scale of 100 to 300.

3 Passing Score

To pass each subtest, you must obtain the minimum passing score listed or higher.
